A sophomore from Andover High School gained the most individual honors on the 1978 Observer & Eccen-tric All-Area Girls' Track Team.

Kori Gifford won first team honors in three events after her first varsity high school season.

Our All-Area team was selected from ballots mailed in by local girls varsity coaches. Each local coach was sent a ballot and a stamped envelope.

One of Gifford's first team posts was in the long jump. She led the Observer & Eccentric long jump listings with a 17-11 leap.

She also received first team mention in the 220- and 100-yard dashes. Gifford had the best local time in both events with a :25.5 in the 220 and an :11.0 in the 100.

Gifford made a fine showing in the Class A state finals. She placed seventh in the 100-yard dash with an: 11.3 and fifth in the 220 with a: 26.2 clocking.

Kirkland is in his third year as the Mercy coach. He posted a 4-1 dual meet record and wrapped up the Catholic League and Class A Regional championships. Mercy was ninth in the state finals.

Mercy's record is particularly impressive in that Mercy does not have a track. Mercy must practice in the parking lot and run its meets at other schools.

Michele Collins of Mercy won top honors in both the 890-yard and mile runs. A junior, Collins had the best local 880 time with a 2:18.5. She was fourth in the state finals of that event.

Collins also led all local runners in the mile with a 5:20.1 clocking. In the mile Collins placed second in the regional and sixth in the state finals.

Beth Bosse of Mercy earned the first team discus spot. Her best throw of 1024% led all local throwers. Bosse's best throw came in the Catholic League-Public School League meet. Another junior standout, Bosse was second in the discus at the Catholic League meet discus at the Catholic League meet.

Junior Julie Basford, sophomores Sherry West and Kathy Whalen and senior Terry Whalen head up Mercy's 20-yard relay quartet. Their 1:47.0 clocking was the best local time. They finished second in the regional and third in the Catholic League meet.

SENIOR LVNN Yadack, sophomore Carole Basford and Jiniors Julie Basford and Jiniors Julie Basford and Chris Dezmam are Mercy's first team mile relay squad. Their 4:079 is better than any other local high school team. This group won the Cass A regional and finished third in the Catholic League meet.

Terri Duckett of Farmington Harri-son received the first team nod at high jump. Duckett's 55 leap was tops among local jumpers. It tied the Oak-land County meet record. A junior, Duckett was also Western Six League champion in this event.

Harrison teammate Ruth Grabowski also received a first team honor, taking the top spot in the 440-yard dash. A senior headed to the University of Michigan on a track scholarship, Grabowski has posted the fastest local 440-yard dash time the past two seasons. She clocked a :58.4 this season. She shocked regional and Western Six champ the past two years.

Sheri Direnfeld of Southfield High School was voted our first team shot putter. She was voted the most value able sophomore at Southfield. Her best put of 34-9, thrown in an early-season dual meet, was not topped by any other local shot putter.

Molly Potter of Lahser was named first team in the two mile run. She had the second best local time, an 11:38.3, just behind an 11:23.0 posted by Mercy's Sue Heinlen.

Wiming the first team nod at the 110-yard low hurdles was Mary Beth Dudash of Birruingham Groves. Dudash had the second best performace in the Observer & Eccentric Histories. She posted a :18.2 time, behind a :18.4 clocking by West Bloomlies opportunity of the control of the

Other members of that relay team

regional. They also had the best local
time in the 440-yard relay, a:50.3 performance.
