#### OU adds programs

The Oakland University Board of Trustees has approved new graduate programs in computer and informa-tion science, linguistics, and public administration.

"IT SEEMS highly probable that the mother had contact with the antigen (agent) before the birth of the infant, and, as a result, she developed antibodies (defense). We found antibodies in the blood of both mother and the expired infant," states W. Wilbur Ack-ermann, Ph.D. U-M professor of epidemiology and head of the SIDS study.

"There is no evidence, however, that the cause of crib death is a single wirst," he adds.
Dr. Ackermann states that there are three more critical steps in unravelling the riddle of crib death; to determine whether one or a group of antigens is involved; to provide more precise diagnosis of SIDS; and to try or recognize high risk groups by prenatal examinations.

"ONE THING is clear from our studies to date, and that is that the presence of antibodies proves that crib death is not inviserious but caused by a complex agents."


