Everything Ms. Fox does is right out in the open. The petite craftsperson works in an irregular space about seven by 12 feet, divided from the remainder of the store by chest high (for her) counters.

Even her outside wall is huge win-dow space. And in her open work-space, she creates one-of-a-kind jew-elry including stickpins, bracelets, earrings, rings and such.

Born in North Carolina, she grew up in this area and attended three different colleges but never graduated.

"I never took jewelry making in high school because I was an apprentice to a jeweler then and worked for bim a total of seven years," she said.
"That's where I got my training."

A LEFTY, Ms. Fox said she doesn't find her left-handedness too much of a problem except when starting to work at a new job.
