Mirrors may break, but they won't peel, fade, rust, soil or shrink. A new process, coating polyester film with aluminum, is said to produce mirrors that are shatterproof.

Mirrors come in practically any size, shape and style. They can take on almost any mood, and seemingly work architectural miracles while doing so.

G. To double the depth of a narrow foyer mirror one whole wall, or have fun with light switches made of mir-


ton with ngm switches made of mirror.
