

## Levin opens local office

Former Detroit City Council President Carl Levin, one of six candidates seeking the Democratic nomination for U.S. Senate, has brought his campaign to Oakland County.

Tom Clark, an administrative assistant to Levin in his years on Detroit's city council, was named coordinator of the Oakland campaign and will head the senatorial hopeful's Oakland office, which is located at 28830 Southfield Road in Southfield.

Also staffing Levin's Oakland County headquarters are Peggy Dickerson of Bloomfield Township, coordinator of volunteer efforts; Keith Goldsman of Farmington Hills, and Dick Gordon of Detroit.

"Field offices such as this one provide a way to take a campaign into local communities," Levin said opening his fifth local campaign office.

"It's important to be close to the people. It's more important than party labels," he said.

Even so, Levin has made Oakland County one of his high campaign priorities. Calling Oakland County a "critical part" of his drive to win the Democratic nomi-

nation, he estimated that 78,000 of Oakland County's Democrats will vote in the Aug. 8 primary.

Levin has already opened local headquarters in Macomb County, Lansing, Grand Rapids and Livonia in addition to his Detroit campaign headquarters. An office in Flint is slated to open in the near future, Levin said.

## Williams seeking new judge seat

Robert C. Williams, chief of the appellate division of the Oakland County prosecutor's office, is seeking election to one of three newly created judgeships in Oakland County Circuit Court.

Williams, 33, of Birmingham was appointed as an assistant prosecutor by former County Prosecutor Thomas G. Plunkett in 1972. In 1973, Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson, who has also endorsed Williams' candidacy, appointed him chief of the appellate division.

Williams will face 13 other candidates in the Aug. 8 primary election.

Williams is a graduate of Princeton University and the University of Michigan Law School. Following graduation from U-M, he taught at Catholic University Law School and served as a clerk for the Michigan Supreme Court.
