"We knew we were going to be playing against the flussians—but we were summed to find out that it was the Olympic team coming out of the locker rooms," said Oakland coach Rose Swidzinski. "They were just awe-some."

Needless to say, the helpless Pioneers were mere and against the powerful Soriets. Against a front line that averaged nearly 6-11, Oatland succumbed, 109-2. The Russians were led by 7-3, 220Den Russian Semenova. The 25-year-old Russian Olympic player dominated action, and kept the callow Pioneers just as far from the basket as they were from home.

"It's kind of a helpless situation when you play against a person like that (Semenova)," said Swidzinski.
"You couldn't move her at all because she was so big. She's massive and just plants herself, And, she was leit-handed, which confused matters even more.

"But overall, I was very pleased with the way our kids handled them-selves," she said.

BESIDES THE U.S. and Russia, two other teams participated in the tournament, which was Mexico's way of celebrating its 75th anniversary of basketball. The tournament was dubbed the Mexican Federation Cup.

The Oakland squad didn't win a game, losing to the Mexican Olympic Team (85-46), the Mexican World Uni-

versity Team (72-51), and, of course, the Russian national team. But, coach Swidzinski and the Pioneers came back with a court full of cultural expe-

"The greatest benefit for us in that trip was the cultural exchange," said Swidzinski, who has guided the OU program from club status to one of the state's best in just three years.
