In the area around Christ Church Cranbrook, Sunday has always been synonymous with the sound of bells.

More specifically, it signals the music of the carillon and during summer months, there's a carillon concert each Sunday afternoon with crowds of listeners relaxing on-the shady lawn near the church, church.

The larger ones were hauled up the side of the tower by wire cables. And even through it was a carefully planned operation by experts from the Mt. Iron Works Inc. of Detroit, there was still a level of excitement as each bell moved up along the tower wall. The heaviest was over 500 poinds—far from the largest in the carillon, which is 2,000 pounds. The total weight of the bells in the tower is a whopping 33,000 pounds. The new carillon was heard for the first time when 100 carillonneurs from around the country met at Christ Church for the Congress of the Guild of Carillonneurs June 16-18.

The carillon, with a total 50 bells, will now rank with the finest in the country.

When the congress met in June, many of the nationally known musicians took a turn at the console and two pieces especially commissione for the occasion debuted. These made possible by a grant Michigan Council for the Arts, were written by Millford Myhre
