Museum displays Chinese paintings

An exhibition of Chinese paintings recently opened at the Detroit Institute of Arts.

"Studies in Connoisseurship: Chinese Paintings from the Arthur M. Sackler Collection" is an important loan presenting traditional brush paintings and calligraphy by 24 outstanding artists active in China from the 14th to the 20 centuries—173 paintings in the form of album leaves, hand Suzanne Miller Sacistant Curator in charge of Asian Art, said the Sackler Collection. Cornerly boused for many years at Princeton University, is one of the finest of its kind in the Western world.

Heart of the exhibition is more than 40 paintings by Tao-chi (ca. 1611-1710), an individualistic and very popular painter of the early Ch'ing dynasty.

"His work is wildly expressive," said Ms. Mitchell. "A single burshstroke canconvey amazing vitality." The Tao-chi paintings in the show demonstrate the full range of his skill in landscapes, figures, bamboo, flower or vegetable subjects as well as in the art of calligraphy.

A number of tracings and freehand copies as well as identified forgeries were purposely acquired for the Sachter collection to enable comparison and, by contrast, to define the iminitable and genuinely personal quality of Tao-chi.
