The Walled Lake School Board offi-cially acknowledged the appointment of Robert Voss and Mrs. Gail Stephens to fill the vacancies at its June meet-ing. Sheldon told the board in June that contracts have already been signed by Voss and Stephens.

SPECIFICALLY, the grievance charges that the school board has violated the master contract with the walled Lake Education Association (WLEA). The section of the contract which has allegedly been violated states that vacancies "shall be filled on the basis of experience, competency, qualifications and other relevant factors. All other qualifications being equal, service in Walled Lake stall be the determining factor."
