## Building dips in Southfield

Building activity in Southfield the first half of 1978 is down from the same period last year.

In the first six months of this year, 254 building starts were estimated at a cost of \$22.4 million, according to Southfield Department of Building and Safety Engineering. Statistic from January through June, 1977, indicate 278 building permits issued at an estimated value of \$36.3 million.

Apartment construction led the field the first six months of 1978 with 14 starts at \$9.2 million. In the same 1977 period, 26 construction permits for apartment buildings were estimated at \$14.1 million.

Commercial building starts accounted for 11 permits at an estimated \$3.7 million this year compared to 13 starts at \$1.3 million in the same 1977 period.
