

Harrison grads keep spirit of '77

A group of Harrison High graduates are attempting to keep the class of 1977 together—but the group's plan to publish a yearly alumni newsletter ran into a snag.

Pauline Hess, class president; Al

Jean, treasurer; and Mark Lichterman, another member of the Class Board, were among those who pushed the newsletter idea last year during graduation. Credit for the origins of "Sequel '77" goes to Harrison advisor John Lanzetta, says Ms. Hess.

"It sounded like a good idea,

because we had a really close class," Ms. Hess said. And an alumni newsletter is a first for Harrison and a first for the Farmington School District, as far as the graduates know.

They had planned to use the school district's non-profit status and mail the newsletters and questionnaires using bulk rates, about two cents per mailing. To cover the cost of the five-year project, they collected \$1 each from more than 220 of their classmates. More than half the class subscribed.

Unfortunately, they discovered the newsletter cannot be considered school district business and thus they had to use third class rates, about 20 cents or 10 times their projected cost, to mail each newsletter that goes out this week.

"WE WERE hoping that we were part of the district and continuing the spirit of the school," Ms. Hess says. Using the school mailings, they had planned to reimburse the district for its expenses. Now that the plan has fallen through, they're hoping to come up with some donations or some other means of keeping their promise to subscribers for the next four years.

"If we had about \$40 a year, we could send it out bulk for the remain-

ing four years," Jean said. Other funding options are to add questions for a sampling survey to their annual questionnaires that go out in the winter. Classmates replies make up the majority of the newsletter, and they hope the newsletter will get better each year as the '77 graduates get farther away from high school days.

"Hopefully, the newsletter will sell itself," Lichterman says. Other '77 grads who want to start a subscription can write to Alumni Newsletter—Sequel '77 Staff, 2808 Oakcrest Drive, Farmington Hills 48018.

The first newsletter filled in the graduates on Harrison activities, as well as including blurbs about individual members of the class of 1977. A hair-raising trip out west contributed by Randy Shaw, a feature by advisor Lanzetta, and class notes rounded out the first copy.

Sequel '77 staffers include Ms. Hess, a student at the University of Michigan; Jean, a student at Harvard and reporter for the "Crimson"; Lichterman, a UM student and political campaigner; and Kim Kopko, Marty Testasecca, Chris Kallgren, Gordon White, Laurie Fletcher, Mary McCaughy, and Pam Ober.
