The fact that the Oak, land County Road Commission (ORC) will not complete the job in 1979 disappointed many of the 100 persons attending the project public hearing lang 2. The 42-mile widening of Orchard Lake will be done in two phases. Financing is available for the first phase, but not the second. OCRC Managing Director John Grubba says the county doesn't have thurds for Praseeral funds available for the project at this time. "We've never built a bigger road project." says county tighway engineer Paul Van Rookel. Phase I. from Twelve Miles to Mayle roads is to Willes to Mayle roads in the Weller of the Project at this time.
