

# Cleland stars in AAU championship meet

Rochester's Doug Cleland continued his impressive swimming streak at the Michigan AAU State Swimming Championships last week.

Competing in the 11-12-year-old category, Cleland broke six state records and one national record. The 12-year-old youngster placed first in every event he entered.

The new state records Cleland now owns are in the 100-meter butterfly (1:07.44), 50-meter backstroke (2:31.07), 200-IM (2:27.94), 50-meter breaststroke (1:36.00), 50-meter freestyle (1:27.49) and the 100-meter backstroke (1:39.83).

Cleland's national record came in the 50-meter butterfly, which he won with a time of :28.83. He also won the 200-meter freestyle (2:15.04) and the 100-meter breaststroke (1:20.70).

Jim Bruzese, 13 years old, swim-

ming in the 13-14 age group, placed second in the 100-meter breaststroke (1:16.45) and second in the 200-meter IM (2:26.49). Bruzese took third in the 100-fly, fourth in the 200-meter breaststroke, sixth in the 100-free and seventh in the 50-meter freestyle.

Antoine Kyser placed third in the 100-meter breaststroke with a time of 1:26.68. He took fourth in both the 50-meter breaststroke (1:38.40) and the 50-meter freestyle (1:27.49) in the 11-12 boys' division.

Eleven-year-old Sherrie Fedal placed fifth in the 100-meter breaststroke with a time of 1:29.47. In the 15-18 division Matt Martin placed seventh in the 100-free with a time of :57.18 and fourth in the 50-free with a time of :25.85.

The 13-14 boys' 400-meter medley relay and 800-meter freestyle relays each took eighth place. The foursome was composed of Ben Stern, Dan Wery, Mike Aguilar and Bruzese.

The girls' 15-18 freestyle relay team of Chrissy Gale, Martha Peters, Kyrston Peterson and Cathy Schmitz placed seventh. The 400-meter relay team of Mary Gell, Peters, Peterson and Gale finished eighth.

The AAU swim championship were held last weekend at the Southfield Civic Center in its 50-meter Olympic-size pool. The Oakland Live Y'er team was coached by Martha Spialburg and Andy Meyers.

Swimmers with the best qualifying times from that meet will travel to Battle Creek on Aug. 19-20 for the last AAU meet of the summer.

## HEART OF THE HILLS

In its last regular dual-meet of the summer season, Rochester's Heart of the Hills lost to Woodbrook 300-266.

The team is now preparing for the Northwest Suburban League championships which will be held for the very first time in a 25-meter outdoor pool. The site is the Beechwood Recreation Area at Beech and Nine Mile roads.

The league meet will take place this weekend, with preliminary rounds scheduled for Saturday and finals on Sunday. On each day the competition will start at approximately 8 a.m.

"We showed (against Woodbrook) that we are ready for the league

meet," said Heart of the Hills coach Tom Boyd. "Everyone is in good form and ready to go."

"The foundation has been set and now all that is left are the final details," he said. "I expect to make a good run at the league championships."

Twelve-year-old Doug Cleland, who swam in the 13-14 age group to fill voids left by swimmers who were on vacation, broke the 100 IM record with a time of 1:07.0. He also won the 50-fly, and teammate Bob Berry took the 50 breaststroke with a time of :43.3.

Recording a first of the 7-8-year-old girls were Amy Proctor in the 25-yard backstroke, and Clavin Bordin with a time of :25 in the 25 freestyle. Girls carried the 9-10 age group with Chris Stewart and Audra Platz winning in the 50-breaststroke and 50-freestyle, respectively.

Sherrie Fedak was a double winner in her 100-IM with a time of 1:18.4, and the 50 breaststroke with a time of :40.4. Jeanne Fleck captured two first places in the 11-12 girls' division, taking the 50-free and 50-fly.

Winning the 50-free race was Kelly Parks in the 13-14 group. Other win-

ners in that group included Tracy Rogers and Alix Ann Roll.

In the 15-17 girls' division, Cathy Schmitz won the 50-breaststroke with a time of :39.0 and Kathy Krull won the 50-fly in :32.5. Shawn Wery took two firsts, recording a time of :34.1 for the 50-breaststroke and :30.2 for the 50-butterfly.

The 40-year combined age-group team of Nancy Warricka, Carolyn Wery, Audra Platz and Jenny Falvey took a first with a time of 1:07.9. The girls' 52-year medley relay team of

Jeanne Fleck, Sherrie Fedak, Cathy Schmitz and Tracy Rogers won in 2:20.8.

The 6-year boys' team of Doug Cleland, Dan Wery, Shawn Wery and Scott Ogg was a winner, and the 64-year free relay girls' team set a new record. The team of Kyrston Peterson, Peggy Berry, Kathy Krull and Kelly Parks set a new mark of 1:36.6.

Following the league championship, Heart of the Hills team will have an awards banquet at Heart of the Hills Center on Aug. 13 at 7 p.m.

## Southfield girl is MVP

Sue Owens of Southfield led her softball team, the All-Sports, to victory last weekend in the USSA National World Tournament, held in Tallahassee, Tenn.

Owens, who attends Southfield Lathrup High School, was named Most Valuable Player in the tourney for her outstanding performance, which included a tournament-leading five home runs.

Twenty-four teams participated in

the Class A softball event, which was for girls between 15 and 17 years of age. The All-Sports lost their first game of the double elimination tourney Saturday but came back to win five straight on Sunday for the championship.

The All-Sports, operating out of Garden City, accomplished a similar feat in the state tournament. Facing elimination after their first loss, the team came back to win six straight games for the championship.
