Immunizations are a must before entering school

New clothes, books and supplies bead the list of what most children must have before going back to school this fall, but for children entering school for the first time, there is at least one other must.

Michigan state law requires that all children enrolling in a Michigan school for the first time be immunized against certain common children enrolled against certain common children of the seases before they can begin school. The law exempts parents with onliert to immunizations because of religious schools can be schools can exchade the seases before they can begin school. The law exempts parents who object to immunizations and ispore having their children protected.

Under Michigan law, these parents are subject to a penalty of 99 days in jail andorn \$100 fine.

Children must be protected against dipheria, tetanus slockjaws, pertussis exhopoing coughs, measles, Rubellia and polio and tested for tuberculosis, according to Dr. Charles Wolf, pediatrician at Henry Ford Hospital's West Bloomfield Center.
