

## Class offers help for aching backs

The Y's Way to a Healthy Back is a program new to the area, and it will be offered by Farmington Area YMCA Mondays and Thursdays, beginning the week of Sept. 18.

"Michigan is a company," said Kay Burns, the Y's physical fitness specialist. "So why not take your aching back to a group session?"

The six week program was developed, in part, by Hans Kraus, an expert in rehabilitative medicine who treated the late John F. Kennedy and Arthur Godfrey.

"Low back pain commonly results

from the under-exercise and overuse of sedentary living," Ms. Burns said. "Our healthy back program aims at relaxing, stretching and toning back muscles with a series of 18 specially designed exercises."

Participating patients are advised to check out with a doctor before entering the class "because they may be one of six back sufferers whose pain stems from a medical problem," she said.

Registrations are being taken now, and class size is limited.

## Dinner will launch Bnai Brith campaign

William Korey, director of international policy research for Bnai Brith, will be the keynote speaker at the Bnai Brith Honor Awards Dinner in Congregation Adat Shalom, 2991 Middlebelt, Farmington Hills.

He is a world renowned authority on Soviet Jewry and international Jewish affairs. He has been American Jewry's official observer at the United Nations.

The dinner will mark the kick-off of

Bnai Brith's annual campaign on behalf of Hillel Foundations on more than 300 campuses, and the Bnai Brith Young Organization which serves 40,000 high school students nationwide.

Cocktails begin at 6 p.m., followed by dinner at 7 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 14. David Handman, Charles Milian, and Milton Weinstein have been named general chairmen for the affair.

Dinner guests are members of Bnai Brith's special giving clubs: Century, Covenant and President.

The extension of Wayne State University's Hillel Foundation to Oak Park, where it serves students from Oakland University and Oakland Community College, and the purchase of a new facility for Michigan State University Hillel Foundation, are in great part due to the generosity of the club's members.

PROCEEDS from the dinner will support one of the largest youth-serving programs in America, encompassing Bnai Brith Hillel Foundations, the Bnai Brith Youth Organization and the Bnai Brith Career and Counseling Service. These agencies are actively serving more than 100,000 high school and college-age young people.

Bnai Brith was founded in 1943 and now has more than 500,000 members; 13,000 in Detroit.
