Coach Larry Dunn warns, however, that staying a champion is harder than becom-

ing one.
"It's pretty tough to repeat," said Dunn, whose team went undefeated (9-0) in 1977. "You have to have a couple breaks along the way. We had a couple close calls last year against Henry Ford (6-0) and Lamphere (20-13).
