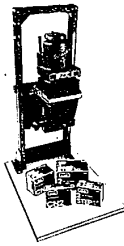

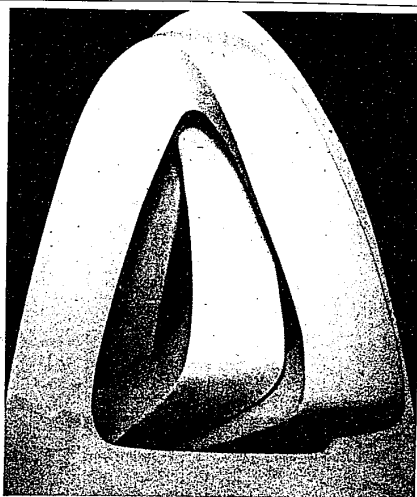

Judges select art works and winners

Every artist in Art 'n Apples is a winner. Each had to be accepted into the show.

Some were selected by members of Rochester Arts Commission. Others had to pass more intense tests. They are the ones who entered the juried Michigan Artists' Judged Show division for professional artists, and those who entered "Sunday Painters" Judged Show for amateur artists.

Winners are part of the festival that opened today and will continue at Rochester Municipal Park through Sunday. Festival hours are noon to 9

p.m. Thursday through Saturday, and noon to 6 p.m. Sunday.

Carol and Allen Rubiner awarded prizes and honorable mentions for the Michigan Artists' Judged Show. The judges selected Douglas Beyerlein's fiberglass sculpture, "Triplicate," for Best of Show. The Rochester man received \$300 in prize money.

Parrella Stump of Rochester won \$200 for Best of Sculpture. Her entry was "Five Children." Best of Photography, also a \$200 prize, was awarded to Fred Warholak of Rochester for a picture titled "Balloons."

"Flower Series '64," entered by Electra Stannels of Hartland, won \$200 with Best of Painting. Best of Fiber, \$200, went to Marilyn Cerny of Rochester for her entry, "Sea Remnants."

Paulette Horseman was selected by the Rubiners to receive the \$200 Special Award for Excellence. Mrs. Horseman of Rochester submitted a drawing of "Julia Ward Howe."

Honorable mentions in the Michigan Artists' Judged Show are James Sheppard, Oak Park; Douglas Nordrum, Rochester; Gerry Post, Rochester;

John Droska, Warren; Richard Wynn, Lapeer; Debra Combs, Detroit; Ritz Stokcen, Rochester; Russell Dunbar, Farmington Hills; Frances Scutari, Rochester; John Neuman, Dearborn Heights; and Adrian Forster, Detroit.

Winners in the "Sunday Painters" Judged Show are first place—\$75 to Warfield Rock, Lake Orion; second place—\$50 to Rose Farber, Birmingham; third place—\$30 to Ellenore S. Reynolds, Mount Clemens and Special Award—\$25 to Bernita Bach, Rochester.
