

Farmington 10th in A field

Lathrup shines in cross country invitational

Southfield-Lathrup finished seventh in the AA cross country at the West Bloomfield Invitational cross country run last Saturday at Marshall Park near Orchard Lake.

Lathrup's best performance came from Andy Krafur, who finished 21st with a time of 15:38.3 over the three-mile course. Other Lathrup finishers: Dave Foley (41st in 16:13.9), Bob Harding (53rd, 16:25.8), Jeff Gelfort (56th, 16:30.5) and John Middlebrook (58th, 16:30.9).

Grosse Pointe North won the AA team title, scoring 79 points, 21 fewer than runner-up Portage Northern. Andy Dillabon of Redford Catholic Central won the AA team race with a time of 14:50.8.

Farmington's three public high schools—Farmington High, Harrison and North Farmington—ran with the smaller Class A schools. Farmington finished 10th with 268 points, and North Farmington finished 13th with 329.

Farmington's John Murphy finished 20th in the individual race with a 15:50 clocking. Teammates Eric Leidlein and Steve Medonis landed 51st (16:37) and 57th (16:40), respectively.

North's Paul Welch took 12th in the A race with a time of 15:32. Gregg Rapp finished 50th in 16:04, and Jeff Temple finished 50th in 16:35.

Flint Kearsley bested the Class A schools with 69 points, and Jackson High was second with 75.

IN A RECENT tri-meet, Farmington High scored 27 points to beat

Southfield (48) and Waterford Kettering (48). The victory was the 100th for Farmington coach Gerald Young. Murphy and Leidlein finished one-two with times of 17:09 and 17:11, respectively, and South-

field's Rob Alexander took third in 17:38.

In another recent meet, Southfield beat Bloomfield Hills Lahser, 23-34, last Monday at Lawrence Institute of Technology. Order of finish: Lahser's Doug Lambert (17:14), Southfield's Alexander (17:22), Southfield's John Yuchas

(17:25), Lahser's Doug Freiley (17:40), Southfield's Shawn Rowley (17:49), Southfield's Rob Hyman (18:03) and Southfield's Mark Vandenberg (18:14).

Royal Oak Kimball defeated Lathrup, 20-38, last Monday in another dual meet. Kimball's Dennis Truby finished

first in 15:44.8, and teammate Steve Orlando took second in 15:52.2. Lathrup's Krafur finished third in 16:04.5. Kimball also won the girls' portion of the meet, 28-39. Lathrup's Kim Rosesteel took third in 21:44.4 behind Kimball runners Liz Watch (20:15.1) and Debbie Morehouse (18:49).

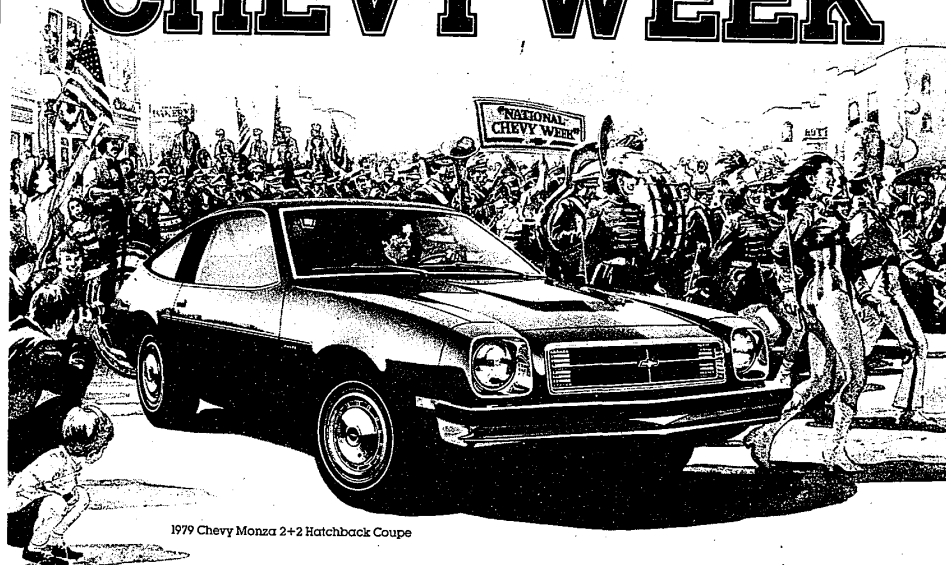

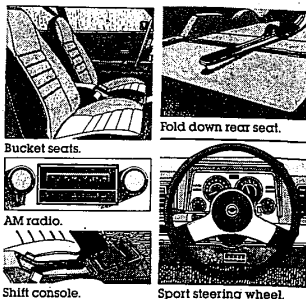
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
