

In Class D' battle

An awesome first half lifted defending Class C state football champion Orchard Lake St. Mary's to a 14-0 season opening victory over Detroit Country Day School, Saturday at Orchard Lake.

Eaglet junior quarterback Jim Kinville engineered touchdown drives of 69 and 53 yards in the first two quarters of his debut. Orchard Lake was also stopped at the seven yard line as time ran out in the second quarter.

Also making a successful opening

experience was first-year head coach Al Dicken.

"Our offensive line controlled the line of scrimmage during the first half," Dicken said. "The second half was played between the 30 yard lines. "It was a big game for Jim Kinville," Dicken said. "He stood in the

pocket real nice to find the open receivers."

After receiving the opening kickoff, Orchard Lake drove 69 yards in 14 plays for its first touchdown. David Kay capped the drive with a two-yard run over left tackle. Nua Vucinaj kicked the extra point.

Kinville clicked with Vucinaj on a key play of that scoring drive. Faced with a fourth down and five yards to go at Country Day's 25 yard line, Kinville completed an 11-yard pass to Vucinaj for the first down.

EARLY IN THE second quarter, Kinville tossed another 11-yard pass to Vucinaj, this one good for a touchdown. It climaxed a seven-play, 63-yard drive. Vucinaj again kicked the extra point.

Kinville completed eight of 11 passes for 96 yards. Vucinaj caught five for 58 yards.

Orchard Lake had a total offense of 223 yards. David Kay and Tom Sikora rushed for 59 and 52 yards respectively.

The final scoring threat of the game,

by either side, came as time was running out in the first half. With the Eagles at the seven yard line, Kay attempted a halfback pass into the end zone. Country Day's Ed Lennon knocked the ball down, ending the threat.

During the first half, Orchard Lake controlled the ball, with 33 offensive plays compared to 17 for Country Day.

Fumbles, interceptions and penalties symled any offensive threat by either team in the second half. Both teams were intercepted twice. Country Day lost two of three fumbles. Orchard Lake lost its only fumble.

The Eagles drew three penalties for 25 yards. Country Day had four penalties for 40 yards.

Country Day's Yellow Jackets gained 133 yards total offense. Only 25 yards came through the air. Country Day's junior quarterback, Dave Colvin, completed three of 10 passes.

"OUR INEXPERIENCE showed in the beginning," said Country Day coach Joe D'Angelo. "We were a little too cautious. They did pretty much

what we were prepared to handle. "I was pleased with our second half," D'Angelo said. "Colvin handled the team well for his first time at quarterback. Our front defensive four played well. We need some work in our defensive backfield."

Both Orchard Lake and Country Day open their league schedules this week. Orchard Lake plays host to Catholic League opponent Detroit Benedictine, 2:30 p.m., Sunday. Benedictine defeated Niles Brandywine 31-6 in its season opener.

Country Day will host Metro Conference opponent and traditional rival Cranbrook, 1 p.m. Saturday. Cranbrook suffered a 28-0 defeat at the hands of Centerline St. Clement in its opener last Friday.

There still is hope that the National Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum will be located in Detroit.

When the selection committee met last week in Milwaukee the list of cities bidding for the hall was reduced from 25 to 8 and Detroit was among the survivors.

The other eligible cities include Akron, Ohio, Cincinnati, Milwaukee, Oklahoma City, St. Louis, Toledo and Springfield, Ill. The final selection will be made in February.

Mary Mohacsi, the 1978 bowling queen, was up to her old tricks in the Ladies Classic at Garden Lanes. She posted a 626, while Ann Setlock was her nearest rival with a 582.

In the Vinco league, George Winkowsky was top man with 534.

IN THE INVITATIONAL DOUBLES at Merri-Bowl, Cheryl Mertz paced the high scorers with a 235 in 598. Judy Kubit was next in line with a 224 in 590, and Sue Stennett landed third with 582 that included games of 213 and 217.

In the Livonia Metro men's league, Larry Paniezoli had a high game of 268 and in the American Legion league, Jerry Pomeroy was high individual with a 235.

HAL JOLLY didn't waste any time making his presence felt in the Little Caesar's league at Westland Bowl. He came through with a 279 for a 678 to set the pace. Others in the front rank were Charlie Brook with a 257 and Ron Eisenbers with a 649.

BILL STEPHENSON got off to a flying start in the junior house league at Farmington Lanes. With the benefit of a 279 game, he rolled a 661 series to take top honors.

THE WOODLAND WOMEN did well in their opening session when Judy Rumps paced the Flyers with a 68 in 512.



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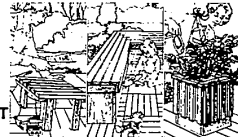
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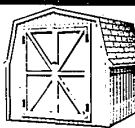
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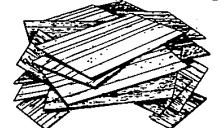
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
