Cranbrook Academy of Art Museum—The museum reopens with "Cranbrook Artists '78." Renovation began last summer while the museum was closed. Interior walls have been removed and others added. The museum has more than 10,000 square feet of space for exhibitions. Also remodeled were the lower level gallery and the bookstore.
