

College appoints 'manager' top man

Robert F. Roelofs, former president of Macomb County Community College (MCCC), is Oakland Community College's new president.

The OCC Board of Trustees unanimously selected the 60-year-old Roelofs for the post last week. Roelofs will begin his \$53,900-a-year job Oct. 1.

For OCC it marks the beginning of a new era.

Roelofs is self-made administrator and manager—a definite change from the late Joseph Hill and Interim President Derek Nurney.

"I don't expect to do anything revolutionary," he told the trustees and a crowd of about 50 persons who came to see the changing of the guard.

"No president, no single person does very well by himself. It's the whole organization. And it's my job to make sure the organization works effectively," he said.

THEREIN LIES the change for OCC.

"It seemed like we needed a good manager," said Trustee David Hackett. Trustees, by and large, agreed with that assessment.

One of OCC's major needs, he said, was to replace "disunity" with harmony.

LILA JOHNSON, the board's vice-chairwoman and a 14-year

board member, said OCC, like any other community college, is going through phases.

"Our first president (Dr. John Tirrell) did an outstanding job in getting the college launched," she said. "Next we needed stable educational programs. Dr. Hill did that."

"Now we have to turn our attention to management and organization," she said.

ROELOFS, AFTER a career in the steel industry, came to MCCC. His background is almost totally in the management and administration of the steel industry. He served as MCCC's president for three years.

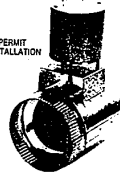
