

Oakland University opens music series

Organ virtuoso Joachim Grubich will appear in concert at Oakland University Friday, Oct. 13, part of the Polish-artist's first American concert tour.

Grubich will perform at 8 p.m. in Verner Recital Hall to open the university's 1978-79 International Music Series. Tickets are \$4 general admission and \$3 for students, available at the door or in advance by calling 377-2300.

The artist has appeared in concerts all over the world. His many awards include first prizes at the Polish Competition of Early Music and at the International Music Competition in 1963 in Geneva, Switzerland. He was the first organist to ever win this at the Geneva competition.

Grubich's concert repertoire covers all styles and periods of organ composition from early Renaissance and Baroque to contemporary works. He

has recorded in Poland and France. In addition to his heavy concert schedule, he is professor of organ at both the Warsaw and Krakow conservatories.

For his Oakland University concert the artist will perform the Toccata, Adagio and Fugue in C Major, by J.S. Bach; the Concerto in D Major, Bach Vivaldi; Toccata and Fugue in D minor, by J. S. Bach; Handel Organ Concerto, Op. #4, by G.F. Handel; Toccata 2, by Tadeusz Paciorekiewicz; Image, by Juliusz Luciak; and Dieu parmi nous, by Olivier Messiaen.

OU organ concerts are performed on the Kyes pipe organ. The instrument has a mechanical tracker action, noted for its expressivity, and it follows the design of traditional instruments built in the Baroque era during the time of Johann Sebastian Bach. The organ is the gift of Mrs. Roger M. Kyes, charter trustee emerita.

Cranbrook Music Guild launches new season

Cranbrook Music Guild's 27th concert series begins Oct. 10 with the Pippo-Laing duo in recital at 8:30 p.m. in the Cranbrook House library.

Cellist Richard Pippo and pianist Fortaine Laing are noted for sensitivity and balance in their classical interpretations. Their repertoire includes selections from Beethoven, Brahms, Shostakovich, Bach, Debussy, Britten and others.

Pippo has studied with master musicians including Vronsky and Rubin at the Aspen Music School. Laing earned music degrees from both the University of Texas and the University of Michigan. She is a well-

known accompanist and teaches at the Grasse Pointe Conservatory.

Their recital is the first of the 1978-79 chamber music programs presented by the 200 member Cranbrook Music Guild, a group that offers quality music on a continuing basis.

The setting for this and all performances is Cranbrook House, the English country manor home of Cranbrook founders George and Ellen Scripps Booth.

Eggplant is good for freezing

As you look at the deep rich purple of an eggplant crowned with its grey-green cap, you will agree that this is the king of vegetables. Select eggplant when they have developed a full, bright color with a

deep purple skin, but still are firm to the touch.

For freezing, wash, peel and cut into slices or cubes. Dip into a solution of one tablespoon lemon juice to one quart of water. This helps keep

the eggplant whiter. Blanch for four minutes in boiling water. Cool quickly, dip again in lemon juice solution. Drain well. Freeze at once. Eggplant will keep high quality frozen for about three months.
