## Improvement tips can cut remodeling costs

Modernization may be cheaper than moving, but with inflation driving up prices, many a homeowner is looking for ways to keep improvement costs down. The Asphalt Roofing Manufacturers Association offers these suggestions:

when remodeling, it's obviously sim-pler and less expensive to convert existing space, such as a garage, base-ment or attic, into a finished room than to build a new addition.

If a new addition is required, how-ever, building it out from an exisiting wall should help reduce the cost and amount of material required.

Horizontal construction is usually cheaper than vertical construction requiring a new second or third floor.

Before hiring a contractor, draw a sketch of what you want the addition to look like or discuss your ideas with a contractor and have him come up with a remodeling plan.

Stock items and standard sizes, therever possible, make for efficient and economical modernization.

Odd-sized components have to be custom-built and are expensive. The use of standard items on the other hand usually result in lower installation and labor costs.

Cet at least three bids on your remodeling project. This is often the only way you'll have of determining what a fair price is. Don't be misted by the lowest bid, however, especially if it is considerably lower than others. When asking for bids, be sure all contractors are bidding on the basis of the same specifications and quality of workmanship and materials.

Once work has begun, don't request a change in plan or materials unless you are prepared to pay extra. Careful planning before giving the contractor the go-ahead avoids this mobilem.
