Few crime victims ask compensation

There's violent crime in Oakland County, but from the Crime Victims Compensation Board's perch you'd be hard-pressed to find it.

hard-pressed to find it.

"The compensation board, which cel-chrated its first birthday last week with an Oakland County meeting, has alpeady awarded nearly \$50,000 to about 490 victims across the state. Duly 27 Oakland residents filed claims, boyever, the successful ones collected only \$5,000 all told Wayne County resi-dents, meanwhile, got nearly half of the money.

"It's a disgrace," said Thomas
Woods, chairman of the fledgling
