'Streetcar Named Desire' opens Players 1978-79 season

Three of the leading performers from the Farmington Players' 1977 production of Tennessee Williams' "Night of the Iguana" have teamed up again as principals in another Williams play, "A Streetcar Named Desire."

The play opens the season of productions to be staged in the Players Barn on Twelve Mile, between Orchard Lake Road and Farmington Road.

It will run three consecutive weekends: Nov. 3-5; 9-12 and 15-18. Performances begin at 8:30 p.m. on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, and at 7:30 p.m. on Sunday.

Janice Salisbury of Farmington Hills will appear as Blanche DuBois. Sandy

Ditrich, of Troy, takes the role of Stella Kowalski and Jack Grulke, of Birmingham plays Harold Mitchell, known in the play as 'Mitch.'

Stanley Kowalski will be played by Ronald Turk, of West Bloomfield, who appeared opposite Ms. Salisbury in the Players' critically-acclaimed production of "A Doll's House" last winter.

Well into rehearsals now, "Streetcar Named Desire" is being directed by Nancy Harrower, a Southfield schoolteacher who has been directing and performing in community theatre for more than 20 years.

For the Farmington Players, she directed "Come Blow Your Horn," "Death of a Salesman" and "Othello."

"THIS IS A brilliant, implacable play about the disintegration of a woman (Blanche), or if you like, of a society," Ms. Harrower says.

"It explores the loneliness of human existence and the strength required in the individual's attempt to gain his or her 'rightful' position in society."

Others appearing in the cast are Julie Tibbitts, Gary Strong, Vic Baidari and John Knack, all of Farmington Hills; Sharon Kolbasa of West Bloomfield; Doug Buckley of Novi; and Shariar Douglas of Southfield.

Other productions on the players' line-up for the season are "The Importance of Being Earnest," and "The Philadelphia Story."
