The Oakland County Association for Relarded Citizens (OCARC) is trying to make sure the county's retarded

It means being a teacher, a courselor, and a confidant.

Citizen advocacy made its debut in 1970 under the sponsorship of the National Association for Retarded

Citizens.

"It's purpose," says Ms. Castaldini,
"is to help individuals coming from
institutions to live more independently
and to help them learn the skills which
are more difficult to pick up."

That could include basic living
skills, good eating habits, learning to
cook a simple meal, cleaning an apariment and even learning to count
money and playing sports, she said.

WHAT DOES IT take to be an advocate? Michael is asked. "A willingness

That's probably the main ingredient."
And it takes caring, they agree.
Henry, who is finally undergoins
some badly needed dental treatments;
probably never would tell a social
taldfini says. But he told Michael who
helped to find a free dental clinic.
"You have to really like the person." Michael says. "You can't view a
personal relationship as a job, If I
viewed his guy," he said, nodding
toward Henry, "as a job, I wouldn't
like it."

MICHAEL, A GRADUATE student at Michigan State University, says he got involved in OCARC's advocacy program because he wanted to "make a contribution."

He met Henry at 'Pontiac's Hawthorne Center for Vocational Training.

Henry-attentive, sometimes shymow lives in a foster home. His "step-mother" also has nine children of her
own to raise.

Before being placed in the commu-

nity, he lived at the Clinton Valley Center, an institution for theemolio-nally disturbed. "He should have never been there. He's mentally retarded not emotionally disturbed," Ms. Castaldini says.

"MIKE AND HENRY hit it off right from the start," she says. Some persons, she cautions, may not be ready for a one-to-one relationship though. Some people may not even want that kind of realtionship, she caue.

But there are other ways people can become involved. Church goups and other organizations could become group advocates" to one of the group homes for the mentally retarded. "These groups could get them involved in a bowling league, or give them a party or take them on princis. They could even get some of their members to come over and just talk to them," she says.

OCARC now has about 25 advocates, Ms. Castaldini said. But it needs more An upcoming public service adver.
