

# Goal line stand saves North Farmington, 9-7

Solid hitting, sportsmanship and class were evident all over the field Friday from the pre-game warmup to well after North Farmington had defeated Westland John Glenn 9-7.

One couldn't have asked for more in the Northwest Suburban League show-down that attracted a packed house at Glenn and a television audience throughout the metropolitan area.

When the battle ended, North, now 6-0 overall and 3-0 in conference competition, went wild with jubilation.

The gridirers in the quiet Glenn locker room fought back the tears while consoling themselves with the knowledge that they had given the Raiders their best shot.

The big play of the contest occurred during a fourth-and-inches situation at the North goal line midway through the fourth period.

Glenn coach Chuck Gordon, trailing at the time 8-7, elected to attempt a field goal for possible victory.

The center snap could not be handled cleanly by holder Ed Hamel and Kal Deluca never had the chance to swing his usually reliable kicking foot.

Hamel finally got a handle on the ball, ran for his life to the short side of the field and hurled the pigskin into the endzone.

A Glenn player snared the desperation pass and wild shouts of joy enveloped the Rockets' cheering section.

However, their ecstasy was premature.

The pass was caught by a lineman, an ineligible receiver. The apparent TD was nullified, Glenn was penalized 10 yards and lost possession.

After that, the Rockets had only one series—three offensive plays—before time ran out.

North scored the first points of the game at 8:45 of the first quarter on a 13-yard blast off right guard by Jeff Cohen on a delay. The PAT kick attempt by Tim Quinn was unsuccessful.

The TD play came immediately after Jim Minihmet picked off a pass that deflected off the hands of Brad Jennings.

Glenn tied the score midway through the second quarter on a 16-yard touchdown pass from Rob Suida to Dale Luke. The Rockets moved 56 yards in eight plays after Jim Hendrix recovered a fumble by North quarterback Greg Goldstein.

Deluca kicked the point-after to give Glenn a 7-6 lead.

The Raiders marched from their own 28 yard line to Glenn's four after receiving a punt and Quinn booted a 21 yard field goal at 9:30 of the third quarter for what turned out to be the winning points.

The kick barely stayed inside the right upright.

"We've been waiting three years for John Glenn," said North coach Ron Holland. "The kids believed right from the start they could win."

"At halftime, we talked about what we would have to do and we did it. We

knew we'd have to have a goal line stand and stop them on a two-minute drive.

"Their kids are super. They have great players and great coaches," said Holland.

"They're as good a team as I've seen since I've been here (1973)," said Gordon of his adversary. "I think that's the most physical game we've played."

"Our kids never gave up. They played their hearts out. That's all you can do."

North netted 206 yards—166 rushing and 40 through the air. Mike Miller ran for 76 yards on 20 carries and Cohen tallied 69 yards on eight runs.

The Rockets produced 180 yards total offense, 99 over land and 81 passing. Tim Ruark accumulated 55 yards with 19 carries.

## Stevenson wins, 17-14

# Field goal sinks FHS

Tom Smith's 26-yard field goal with only 31 seconds left in the game boosted the unbeaten Livonia Stevenson football Spartans to a hard-fought 17-14 Inter-Lakes League victory Friday over the Farmington Falcons.

Mike Shimsky dashed 60 yards with less than six minutes left to bring Stevenson to within two points, 14-12. Reserve quarterback Jim Fox hit a diving Peter Lokar in the corner of the endzone to knot the score and set the stage for Smith's game-winning boot.

Stevenson coach Jack Reardon couldn't have been happier with the way his team fought back.

"The kids just wouldn't give up," said Reardon following the big win.

"We knew they'd be tough, despite their record. They're just a few tough ones."

Stevenson's Richard Parks returned the opening kickoff 92 yards for an apparent touchdown, only to have it called back by a clipping penalty.

Despite the call, the Spartans made their opening drive count as they went 60 yards in seven plays to score on

Smith's ten-yard scamper around right end.

Quarterback Dave Hall's 34-yard completion to Cap Pethers was instrumental in the drive. The extra-point was wide and Stevenson was out to an early 6-0 lead.

However, the Falcons were not ready to play patsy for the Spartans, as they proved the first time they got their hands on the ball.

Backed to their own one-yard line following Stevenson's kickoff and a fake reverse, the Falcons mounted a 99-yard drive that featured a 53-yard off-tackle run by Farmington's Dave Hall.

Hall went the final two, and following the successful extra-point try, the Falcons found themselves on top, 7-6.

The Spartans drove deep into Falcon territory twice in the second quarter, only to be thwarted on fourth down plays each time.

The swarming Farmington defense, led by cornerback Tom Eby, even managed to stop the Spartans on a fourth and goal from the one

Farmington took the second-half kickoff and marched to the Spartan 15 before Shimskey, a standout on defense as well, intercepted a Falcon pass, ending the threat.

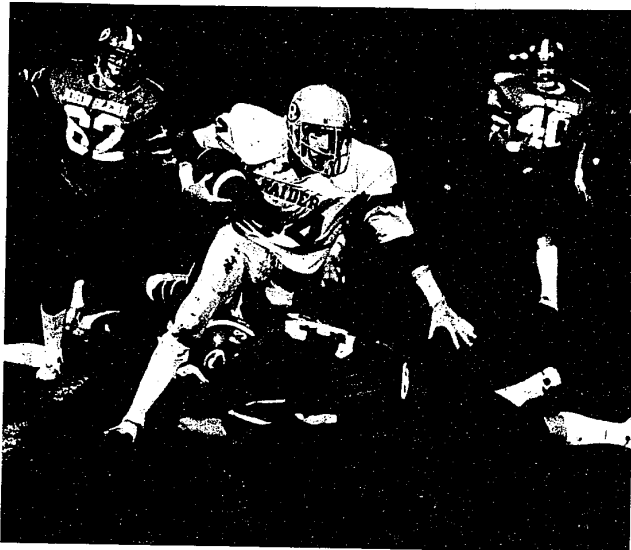
Shortly after, Stevenson suffered what could be a major setback when quarterback Dave Hall was helped from the field with an apparent knee injury.

Farmington used roughing the kicker and pass interference calls to force 46 yards in seven plays as Don Kaminski barreled through the middle for the final five.

The extra-point again was good, and Farmington's lead stood at 14-6 as the third quarter ended.

This set the stage for the last minute Spartan heroics that upped Stevenson's overall record to 6-0, while its unblemished 4-0 league record leaves them in good shape to vie for conference honors.

And who knows? A berth in the Class A state playoffs is not out of the question for Reardon's gridirers.
