

# On 2 TD passes

## Harrison stops Canton, 14-8

Two touchdowns passes from Drew Norton to Jon Brancheau sparked Farmington Harrison to a 14-8 Western Six League victory over Plymouth Canton before a sparse Saturday night crowd at the Centennial Park.

The triumph raises Harrison's league record to 3-1. The Hawks will take their 4-2 overall mark into this week's game against Northville in what will prove to be a battle for second place in the conference. Canton's record dropped to 1-3 in the league and 3-3 overall. The Chiefs battle Walled

Lake Western at the Warriors' field Friday night.  
After Harrison scored its two touchdowns, Canton scored its two touchdowns when Rusty Mandle sprinted 50 yards midway in the fourth quarter for the Chiefs' lone score of the night. Mandle was the game's leading rusher with 100 yards in 20 carries. Quarterback Scott Dawson threw a flat pass to slot back Steve Gray for the two-point conversion, making the score 14-8.  
On the ensuing Canton kick off, Harrison was able to convert two crucial first downs and held the ball the final five minutes to preserve the victory.

The initial first down came from the hard running of Harrison senior fullback Dave Tumquist, who totaled 66 yards in 23 carries for the night. The other came on a clutch third-down pass from Norton to Mike Twigg which converted 28 yards.  
Harrison kicked off to the Chiefs to open the game and held the home team after three plays from scrimmage. After Canton's punt, the Hawks made the most of their first possession by the only touchdown of the first half.  
Harrison kept the ball on the ground for the first 14 plays of the drive

before quarterback Norton rolled to his right, and found Brancheau all along in the endzone from eight yards out. Steve Twigg, substituting for the regular place kicker Peter Lundberg who was out with a sprained ankle, kicked his first of two extra points to make it 17-0.  
Norton found Brancheau again in the third quarter, this time from five yards out, to make it 14-0. This drive took only seven plays and covered 65 yards.  
Canton's lone score was a six-play, 74 yard drive which saw fullback Mandle carry the ball on every play.

## Kimball surprises Seaholm

HALFBACK DOUG MILES started down the Seaholm line with a second and third effort from 30 yards out to give Kimball its second touchdown, a 14-0 interception lead. The drive lasted four plays.  
When the Maples returned for the second half, overtime still looked possible.  
Senior defensive cornerback Bill Kendro jumped a fumble on the opponents' seven-yard line, creating the lone Maple score in the third period.  
In two minutes, Murphy directed his team seven yards climaxed by his one-yard scoring drive.  
Kendro converted his 21st consecutive extra point, cutting the margin to 14-7.  
Earlier, before the Maples' first score, Miles picked off Murphy bomb thwarting Seaholm's bid for a quick tally.  
Seaholm's hopes for a championship escaped when Kimball quarterback Dale Vestand engineered a 53-yard drive on the ground. Tyrell scored from 12 yards out with 1:48 remaining in the game.  
Vestand's conversion made it 21-7. The game-clincher may have been averted without the aid of Seaholm face-mask penalty which kept the drive alive.

The Maples had a chance to score with four minutes to play when coach Chuck Skinner decided to go to the air. On a crucial fourth down play receiver Bob Moses could not hold on at the Kimball 48.  
The drive had started when end Bill Herweyer caught passes of 16 and 17 yards.  
"The biggest difference was Flanagan, our punter and kicker. He kept Seaholm in the hole," said Kimball coach Paul Termerian.  
Seaholm continually had to start offensive drives from within its 20-yard stripe.  
"We were moving the ball, but fumbled three times and we can't do that against a good team such as Kimball. That was the ball game, said Seaholm coach Skinner.  
"Kendro and Robinson are good players," said Termerian.  
The Maple running combo totaled 39 yards rushing out Seaholm's overall total of 129. The Maple air attack completed but five of 18 passes for 79 yards.  
Kimball rushed for 201 yards. Miles held the cause by going 61 yards in 11 attempts.  
Vestand completed only two passes for 38 yards but only threw three times.  
First downs went in favor of Kimball, 11-9.  
Penalty yardage was close between

the two clubs—35 yards against Seaholm and 25 against Kimball.  
"Seaholm has a fine football club. One of their tactics played a fine game. I don't know why," Termerian said.  
Kimball hosts Ferndale at 7:30 p.m. Friday. Seaholm entertains Berkley at 8 p.m. Friday.  
A Kimball victory gives them their seventh SMA title outright.
