

# Clarenceville ships Willow Run

## CVILLE-WILLOW RUN

With its best all-around offensive effort of the season, Clarenceville cracked Willow Run, 48-36, last weekend in a non-league football meeting.

The Trojans' balanced attack featured 859 yards on the ground and 227 through the air. Willow Run also moved the ball with regularity and netted 315 yards, all but 15 rushing. All the points were scored during the first three quarters.

Clarenceville received the opening kickoff and drove nearly 70 yards for the initial score of the game. Jeff Nabony capped the march by bolting into the endzone from six yards out on an off-tackle play.

The Trojans scored three more touchdowns during the first half, all on passes from senior quarterback Jim Beyer.

Beyer first connected with Jeff Weigand for a 13-yard TD late in the first period after calling an audible at the line of scrimmage.

Beyer observed that the area in which the original running play was designed to go was well defended, so he calmly and successfully adjusted at the line.

Mich Burt, a sophomore flanker, snared two touchdown passes in the second quarter.

The first was a toss of 36 yards and the second carried 41 yards. Beyer rolled left before releasing the ball during each play and Burt made excellent catches while well covered on both.

Clarenceville produced three touchdowns during the third quarter.

Chris Jeffrey, a sophomore, scampered three yards off tackle for the first. Rob Soop dove three yards off right guard for the second and Beyer kept around right end two yards for the third.

"Beyer probably had his best game of the year-a fantastic game," said Clarenceville coach Robb Weddle. "He was really throwing the ball."

The senior completed 16 of 22 passes for 227 yards and three touchdowns. He was not intercepted. Beyer also ran for 21 yards and one TD.

Jeffrey, in addition to running for 64 yards and a touchdown, intercepted two passes and recovered a pair of fumbles.

Nabony ran for 85 yards and Jim Thompson 52 for the Trojans.

# St. Agatha wins 1st game

## ST. AGATHA-MT. CARMEL

"We've been playing well the last few weeks. It's just that we're not winning. But this week we put everything together," said Redford St. Agatha football coach John Goddard after his team defeated Wyandotte Mt. Carmel last weekend, 14-3.

"Our defense has given up only six points in the last three games. It was our offense, with turnovers, that really hurt us before," continued the Aggies coach. The victory over Mt. Carmel was Agatha's first of the 1978 season.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Aggies mounted a 66-yard drive midway in the second period of play. Quarterback Mark Szerlag led the drive and finally scored the touchdown on a three-yard quarterback sneak.

Agatha then went for a two-point conversion but was stopped.

In the third quarter, Mt. Carmel scored when it blocked an Agatha punt. The following two-point conversion put Mt. Carmel ahead, 8-6.

The Aggies put together a 42-yard drive with less than five minutes left in the game, in an attempt to take the lead. Szerlag finally turned the trick with another quarterback sneak, this time from one yard out.

Curis King dove into the endzone on an off-tackle dive for the two-point conversion following the touchdown. That made the score 14-3.

King was the Aggies' leading rusher for the day. He blasted for 14 yards in 22 carries. Agatha totalled 187 yards on the ground and 56 through the air. Szerlag tossed four passes and completed two.

# Notre Dame upsets CC '11'

## CATHOLIC CENTRAL-NOTRE DAME

Where was that famed offense? That was the big question last weekend when Detroit Catholic Central faced Notre Dame in a Catholic League football contest and lost, 7-0, in overtime.

"Our defense was very strong during the game, but we just didn't execute on offense. It came down to the fact that we did the job on defense but didn't do the job on offense," said CC coach Thomas Mach after his squad lost to Notre Dame for the fifth straight year.

"We just didn't block well. It came right down to the basics of football. We didn't block, we didn't execute and we didn't play a very good football game," Mach continued.

For four quarters, the two teams faced each other with strong defenses and held one another outside of the goal line.

In the overtime period, Notre Dame scored first and then the Shamrocks scored.

CC, extremely weak offensively, picked up just 76 total yards on offense. The Shamrocks actually tallied 114 yards but lost 36 in seven quarterback sacks.

Randy Larsen had 71 yards for CC in 24 running attempts, while quarterback Mike Lewis picked up 18 yards in four carries only to lose 36 in sacks. Lewis also completed two of five passes for 19 yards.

"The game was all defense. It was a hard-fought defensive battle. Neither team could move the ball on the ground or through the air," Mach said.

As for the Notre Dame jinx, Mach said that he doesn't believe in jinxes and that it was "a matter of us not doing the job and Notre Dame doing the job on us."
