Repairing Small Appliances

It makes you feel good, it will save you money and, once you gain a little experience, you'll find that fixing small appliances around the house can be surprisingly easy.

All you have to do is remember that when trying to pinpoint the cause of a mailfunction in an appliance,

For example, if you think the power cord is broken on your electric banket here's a good test:
Unplug the cord and examine it for fraying; then examine the plug for lose or distorted prongs. Remove the back cover of control unit and attach jumper wire across power cord leads inside unit. Set volt-ohm meter to RX1



scale and clip its probes to terminals of control cord plug. Bend and pull cord. If cord is okay, meter will read zero ohms; if bad, needle will jump or read high.
