

Farmington girls nip Central

Betsy VanDeusen, a 5-foot-6 junior forward, scored 21 points, and teammate Kay Deeg dropped in two free throws with 30 seconds left to play as Farmington High slipped by Walled Lake Central, 53-50, last Thursday night in an Inter Lakes League girls' basketball game at Farmington.

The victory boosted Farmington to 6-5 overall and 3-2 in the league.

VanDeusen, whose sister Kathy starred for Farmington two years ago, hit six field goals and went nine for 17 from the free throw line.

Deeg added 14 points, and teammate Julie Tadrzynski had 12. Krista Graham scored a game-high 25 points for Central.

Earlier last week, Redford Thurston blasted Farmington 57-31 in a non-league game. Wendy Vandesaen scored 21 points for the winners.

In another game last week, Farmington Our Lady of Mercy ran its overall record to 9-1 with a 55-35 victory over Redford Bishop Burgess in the Catholic League. Mercy is 4-1 in the league.

Patty Schneider scored 13 points and Denise Bassford had eight for Mercy, which led 15-13 at halftime. Vanliem scored 10 points for Burgess.

Earlier, Mercy overcame a 12-point second-quarter deficit and defeated Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher, 65-51. Gretchen Larges led the winners with 20 points, and teammates Deanne Bohfield and Ann Haubold added 12 and 11 points, respectively.

KATHY CORBETT, a 5-10 senior, scored 14 points and pulled down 13 rebounds to pace Farmington Harrison's 34-21 victory over Northville High last Thursday in the Western Six League. Harrison is 5-5 overall and 2-3 in the WSL under coach Neil Redford.

Linda Tremonti failed to score for Harrison, but she grabbed 13 rebounds. Teammate Lana Widman scored nine points. Karen Goexen and Diane Parrish each scored six points for Northville.

Earlier last week, Harrison overcame city-rival North Farmington 49-28, as Widman collected 18 points and Corbett added nine. Janice Higuera led North Farmington with eight points.

North Farmington dropped to 0-11 last Thursday with a 57-20 loss to Garden City East in the Northwest Suburban League.

Dorothy Bocheim scored 12 points for East, which led 21-1 after the first quarter.

Mercy travels to Walled Lake Central for a non-league game at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday (Oct. 24). Other Tuesday games: Thurston at Harrison, Farmington at Southfield High, and North Farmington at Berkley High.

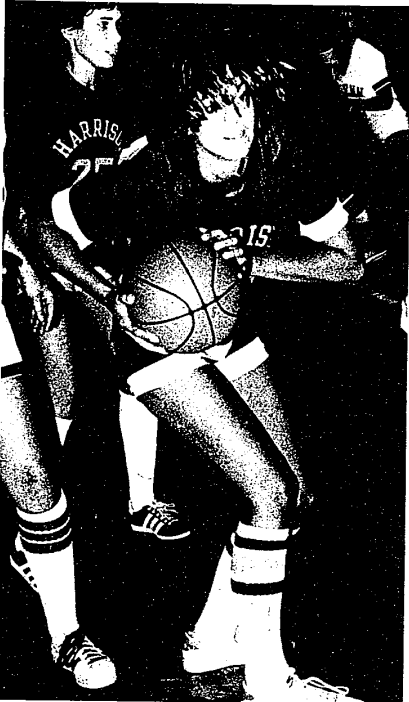

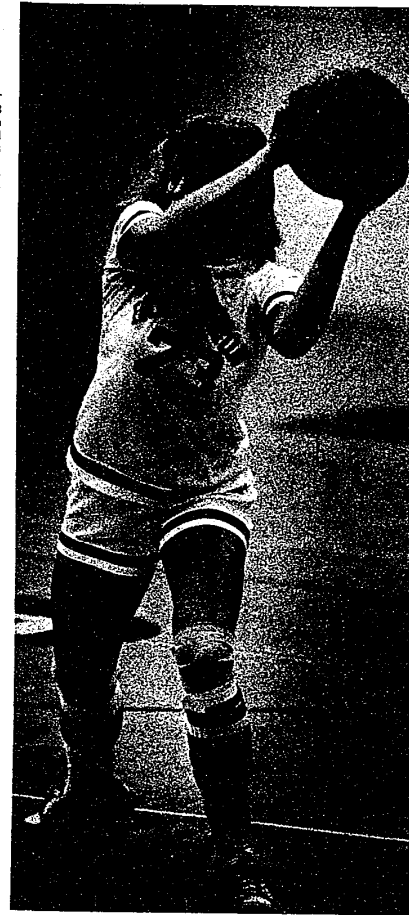

Mercy tankers rip foe

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy boosted its overall record to 6-0 with a 121-51 victory over Southfield-Lathrup in a non-league girls' swimming meet last week.

Mercy's Betsy Leahy established varsity records in the 200-yard freestyle (1:59.5) and the 500-yard freestyle (5:16.6).

She also swam a leg on the 400 freestyle relay (with Beth Saunders, Cathy Cashman, Sue MacMillan), which won with a 3:50.2.

MacMillan won two individual events, the 200 individual medley (2:14.1) and the 100 freestyle (5:47.7). Both were state qualifying times. Sue Miller set a varsity record in the 100 backstroke with a time of 1:03.3.

Mercy swims next on Thursday (Oct. 26) at home against Madison Heights Bishop Foley. The Catholic League contest starts at 6:30 p.m.

N. FARMINGTON-THURSTON

Maureen Jewell won two events and swam on a winning relay to lead North Farmington past Redford Thurston, 59-72, in a Northwest Suburban League meet last Thursday at North.

Jewell won the 100 butterfly (1:06.0) and the 100 backstroke (1:06.1). The 200 medley relay (Debbie Lindsay, Mary Shuey, Jewell, and Britta Nielsen) won in 2:05.5. Nielsen won the 200 free (2:19.6), and Shuey won the 200 IM (2:25.6).

North Farmington, now 4-3 this season, swims next on Tuesday (Oct. 24) at Redford Union. The meet begins at 7 p.m.

Twigg's kick lifts HHS

Place kicker Steve Twigg's successful extra point made the difference last Friday night in Farmington Harrison's 7-6 victory over Northville High in a Western Six League football game at Northville.

Twigg, a junior, kicked his point following Jim Miller's 16-yard touchdown run with 1:37 left in the opening quarter.

Jeff Hagen, a Farmington defensive back, recovered a fumble on the Northville 15-yard line to set up the scoring play.

Northville, known for its passing under quarterback John Marzone, struck with 8:40 left in the second quarter.

Marzone completed a 73-yard TD strike to Joe Schimpf. Russ Gans PAT attempt, however, was wide.

Gans also missed two field goal tries from 45 and 20 yards out, and Twigg was wide on a 23-yard field goal try.

Harrison tailback Dave Turnquist rushed for 103 yards in 25 carries as the Hawks gained 190 yards to Northville's 75. Harrison QB Drew Norton completed three of five passes for 30 yards, while Marzone completed four of nine for 38.

FARMINGTON-REDFORD UNION

Farmington High won seven of the 11 events and defeated Redford Union, 97-72, last Thursday in the Falcons' pool. Coach Mark Holdridge's Farmington team is 6-1 overall.

Farmington's 400-yard freestyle relay (Sally Schuler, Tammy Richardson, Cathy Gregory and Suzanne Sterling) won with a time of 4:01.8. Schuler won the 200 IM (2:29.5), Gregory won the 50 free (1:28.2), Richardson won the 100 fly (1:05.5), Sterling won the 100 free (1:02.7), and Angela Gore won the 100 breast (1:18.4).

On Tuesday (Oct. 24), Farmington enters Walled Lake Central at 7 p.m. in an Inter Lakes League contest.

Farmington won the 200 breaststroke relay (Suzanne Sterling, Edum Bunting, Angela Gore, Sally Schuler) in 2:21.3, and logged a first in the 200 free relay (Laura Edwards, Cathy Gregory, Tammy Richardson and Schuler) in 1:48.4.

Harrison's 200 butterfly relay (Cathy Rudel, Nancy Whitmore, Kathy Hagen and Julie Weiss) won in 2:02.7, and North Farmington's 400 IM relay (Debbie Lindsay, Britta Nielsen, Mary Shuey and Maureen Jewell) won in 4:36.5.

Harrison defensive standouts included Mike Twigg, Steve's brother, who recorded nine solo tackles at his defensive end spot, and tackle Kurt Stearnes, who logged eight solos.

The loss dropped Northville to 3-2 overall and 3-4 in the Western Six League.

Harrison, now 4-1 in the WSL and 5-2 overall, enters city-rival North Farmington at 2 p.m. Saturday (Oct. 28).
