Another wave of high scoring hit the area's establishments during the past week and when the roar of the falling pins faded away, the record books had to be rewritten at both Woodland Lanes and Wonderland Lanes.

The greatest deluge came at Woodland, where four league bowlers broke the 700 barrier to set a new high mark for the house. Another was registered at Wonderland. In both places, the final counts were new high marks for the season.

BOB HAUCK scattered the maples for a 734 on games of 265, 225 and 243 for the 734 in the Wonderland Classic.

With this big total he gained a 54-pin margin on Bill Fite, who landed in second place.

At Woodland Lanes, the top scorer was Gene Mayberry, of the Ford LTD league, who linked counts of 256, 246 and 250 for a 752 that was a new high for the house. Behind him came Steve Blaszcak with 675 and Mike McArthur with a 671.

The other barrier-breaking performances came in the Wednesday men's league where Greg Wizard showed the way with a 728 gained on games of 278, 256 and 204.

With a 258 finish, Ed Kortez landed

second with a 728 and Walt Smith had a 277 for 716 and third place.

The other high scorers in the league included Jeff Anderson with 661, Andy Sapunich with 656 and Charles Hronkowski with 653.

Even the women had a great time at Woodland. Barb Dettore hit a new high for the house with a 654 made possible by a 257 opener and her nearest rival was Pat Sabo with a 223 in 592.

THE SIXTH 700 series came at Westland when Rich Anderson paced the 42-team junior house league with a 717 that came about with a closing game of 258. Right behind him came

Gordie Peterson with a 279 in 696 and Rick Winick with a 268 in 657.

The Westland Ladies also did some fancy scoring and provided their closest finish of the year when Denise Hedge fired a 235 in 620 to beat out Pam Campbell by a single pin.

To help make possible the stirring finish, Pat Mayles fashioned a 614 while Joanne Warner had a 608 and Margie Brothers, despite six splits, had a 601.

In the men's doubles, where they switch lanes after each two games, John Hurley had a 213 and 279 on the

first pair, then posted a 279 and 217 on the next pair for a 1018 count.

THE HIGH-SCORING wave spread to Garden Lanes, where Tom Krause rolled a 677 to pace the Vinco league. Following him were Jerry Ohl with 663, Ray Mische with 638 and Otis Lackey with 636.

In the Wayne County League, Dick Szamota was high with a 666 and his closest rival was Gene Ostrich with a 610.

In actual competition, Dorothy Haggard rolled her first 600 series with games of 200, 243 and 158 for 601, while

Farmington High had won the Inter Lakes League cross country championship for the past four seasons, but Walled Lake Central decided it was time for a change this fall.

Central won the league title by winning the conference meet last Thursday, scoring 36 points at Highland Lakes. Farmington was second with 34. Livonia Stevenson had 61, Milford Lakeland 64, Waterford Township 147 and Pontiac Northern 157.

"Losing the title was a big disappointment for us," said Farmington coach Gerald Young, whose team had beaten Central in a dual meet earlier this season.

"Central ran real well in the league meet, and we had some kids who didn't run well," Young said.

Farmington's John Murphy, a junior, won the individual race with a time of 16:30. Next four finishers: Central's Kevin Atkinson, Central's Bob Sals, Central's Jim Owens, and Lakeland's Al Bieke.
