Another wave of high scoring hit the area's establishments during the past week and when the roar of the falling pins faded away, the record books had to be rewritten at both Woodland Lanes and Wonderland Lanes.

The greatest deluge came at Woodland, where four league bowlers broke the 100 barrier to set a new high mark for the season. Another was registered at Wonderland. In both places, the final counts were new high marks for the season.

BOB HAUCK scattered the maples for a 734 on games of 265, 225 and 243 for the 734 in the Wonderland Classic.

With this big total he gained a 54-pin mark on Bill Pite, who landed in second place.

Even the women had a great time at Woodland. Barb Detorre hit a new high for the house with a 664 made possible by 257 opener and her nearest rival was Pat Sabo with a 223 in 592.

THE SIXTH 700 series came at Westland when Rich Anderson paced the 42-team junior house league with a 717 that came about with a closing game of 268. Right behind him came

Gordon Peterson with a 279 in 696 and Rick Wack with a 268 in 657.

The Westland ladies also did some fancy scoring and provided their closest finish of the year when Denise Hodge fired a 235 in 629 to beat out Pam Campbell by a single pin.

To help make possible the stirring finish, Pat Mayles fashioned a 614 while Joanne Warner had a 608 and Margie Brothers, despite six splits, had a 601.

In the men's doubles, where they switch lanes after each two games, John Hurley had a 213 and 279 on the

first pair, then posted a 279 and 247 on the next pair, for a 1000 total.
