Robber escapes with register loot

A woman armed with a pistol locked a Farmington party store owner in a cooler and made off with \$175 from the cash register Saturday, police report.

The robbery occurred at Tony's Party Store, 3070 Grand River, at approximately 4:45 p.m.

Police gave this account of the robbery: The thief entered the store and asked for a bottle of wine. When a customer entered the store, the woman left, saying she had left her wallet in her car. When the customer left, the woman reentered with a pistol.

She then locked the store's owner, Grace Perez, in the back cooler and fled with the money from the cash register.

The woman is described as white, approximately 30 years old with red hair, 5'2", 110 pounds, and wearing dark sunglasses. According to police,

she is believed responsible armed robberies in Detroit, Hazel Park and Dearborn.

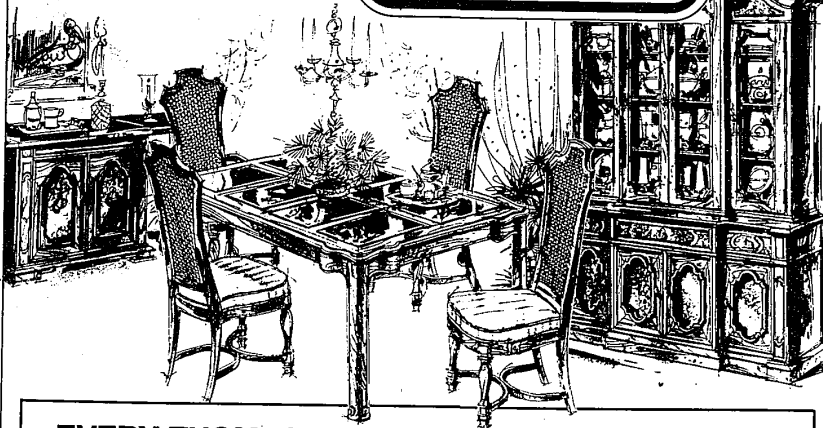

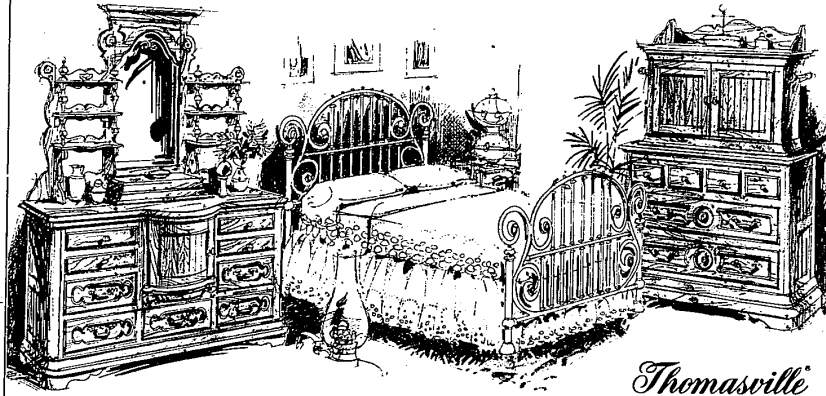

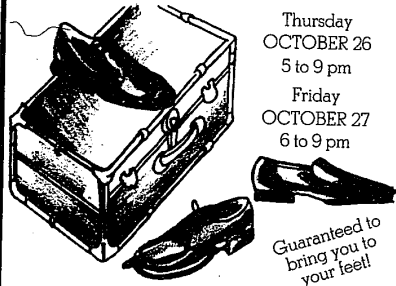
