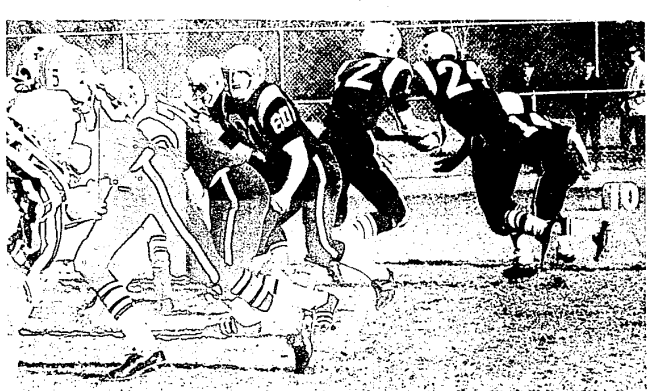

Time Runs Out On West

Victory continues to elude Garden City West's football team, but it's not that Coach Bob Drahm's charges aren't making matters hot and close.

Take the 18-12 setback West suffered at the hands of Taylor Kennedy.

The teams were knotted, 12-12, at the half. Then Kennedy went in front, 18-12, which is the way the game ended -- but not before West scared the daylight out of Kennedy by marching to the Kennedy two when time ran out.

ON THE OTHER two deep penetrations by Farmington, Whitestone arose with big tackles to halt the Falcons.

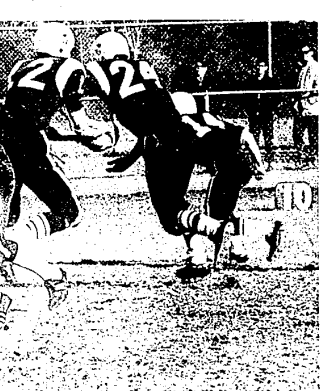

That ended a big evening for Kleinbrook who personally rolled up 160 yards, while Patterson didn't do badly. He carried three times for 80 yards.

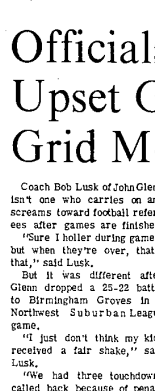
EAST MARCHED 89 yards for its first touchdown, requiring 14 plays to cover the distance before Kleinbrook carried over a yard out.
