Area Color Is Best After Oct. 24

At least one-half million families are expected to take special weekend trips through Michigan between now and early November to see this state's autumnal show-when woodlands turn from summer green to blazing, multi-colored hues of red, yellow, brown, orange, scarlet and purple.

"This means that approximately 1.5 million persons will be on our highways for the sole purpose of viewing forest from late September when colors reach their peak in the Upper Peninsula through the first week

of November when colors fade throughout southern Michigan," according to Jerry E. Fisher, Automobile Club of Michigan's touring manager.

He points out that weekend fall color tourists alone will contribute approximately \$40 million of the record \$1.25 billion expected to be spent on tourism in Michigan during 1969.

"The average color tour will last two days and will cover 300 miles, which means that a total of 150 million miles will be driven," adds Fisher.

Fall color tour dates for Michigan-which can vary as much as a week depending on weather-are as follows:

Central Lower Peninsula- Oct. 10 to Oct. 26.

Southern Lower Peninsula- Oct. 24 to Nov. 2.

Warm dry weather means that colors can remain in an area for two weeks. Cold, wet weather means that colors will be muted. Wind knocks leaves from trees causing a short season.

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
