Nuclear plants are 'wave of the future'

The father of the hydrogen bomb fold a Southfield audience Sunday that "Whoever argues that nuclear plants shall be built is right."

Born in Budapest, Hungary in 1908, he left Europe for the U.S. in 1935 in a flight from the the Hitler regime. From 1911 to 1953, he worked on the wartime atomic bomb project and was alaboratory in New Mexico.

Being the first pope from a Communist country will have its political ramifications, the three priests explain. Pope Paul was twice refused a visit to Poland, but it is expected that with 33 of the possible 35 million Poles being Carbiotic that the mey pope from Poland surely will be granted

Tr. Milewski extracted a sentence he thought significant printed by the Daily American in Rome: "Pope John Paul II in his 40-minute audience with the press said more than did his three predecessors in all the years of their pontificates."

Pope John Paul II has been characterized by Pr. Milewski as a practical man yet personal, one who does not deny his followers contact and personal attention.
