

Schoolcraft kickers
head for tournament

It has been a long hard campaign for the Schoolcraft College soccer team, but now the fruits of a winning season are being harvested by the Ocelots, who will be traveling to the Interregional soccer tournament Friday and Saturday in Chicago.

The Ocelots finished the year with a 12 conference record, which was good enough to place second behind Macomb Community College in Region 13. Macomb had a 9-0 mark. Both squads qualified for the interregionals, beating out seven other teams.

Schoolcraft will be playing against three other squads at the interregionals—Macomb and one team each from Illinois and Wisconsin.

The tournament will be a single-game elimination with the winner advancing to the national tournament in Miami, Fla.

Schoolcraft had the toughest job of all on its way to the interregional competition. The Ocelots were tied for second in their conference (region) with Lakeland College of Ohio which necessitated a playoff game to see who would advance.

Schoolcraft won the game 2-1. John Liscate and Claudio Mancini scored the Ocelot goals. Mancini is from Reedford.

"I thought at the beginning of the season we might make it to the regionals but then we lost three important games and our hopes dropped," said Schoolcraft coach Larry Christoff. "I was pleasantly surprised that we made it."

After those two defeats the Ocelots won four consecutive games before the final playoff contest. Lakeland was the first victim, 2-1. Delta Community College was next, 3-0 and Lorain College third, 1-1.

With those three wins in the bag, the Ocelots bottled Lakeland again in the playoff contest and won.

Rochester girls
outrun field
at state finals

The Rochester High School girls' cross country team, which won the state championship over the weekend, was almost perfect this fall.

The Falcon girls won every meet it participated in except the Holly Invitational, where they finished third.

Other than that, coach Hal Commerford's team won the state and regional championships. The Greater Oakland Activities League (GOAL) title with an unattained 54 mark, the Bishop Feely Invitational and the Oakland County championship.

"I didn't really think about it in state title at the beginning of the year," said Commerford. "I thought we did well at Foley, but there was a small field of only 20 teams."

"Washburn finished sixth, which was her best performance of the year," he said.

"When we won by such a wide margin at the Oakland County meet (20-100), that was impressive. Since then we started working toward the goal of a state title. The team thought about it and they worked hard."

"We didn't have any bad injuries this year, and the ones we did have were able to overcome," he said. "We just had everything going for us at the end."

The Falcons won the first state girls' cross country title offered by the Michigan State High School Athletic Association (MSHAA) with 33 points. Ann Arbor Pioneer finished second, 18 points behind. Brighton was third.

The team's only senior—Bill Wickham—was Rochester's best finisher in sixth place. Sophomore Lisa Franseen (13th) and junior Karen Curtis (18) were also among the top 20 finishers.

"I think that although we lack skill of most college teams nobody can beat us on hustle and desire. I think that was the key to our success this year," continued the coach.

Schoolcraft started the season with an 11-0 record, defeating the unranked Bellville College from Illinois, 2-1. John Stravos and Steve Paul picked up the two Ocelot goals.

Detroit Bible College was the next victim to the Ocelots, 7-1. Macomb scored three goals, Boyd Brueckner scored two, Paul one and Chris Pickard one. Pickard graduated from Livonia Stevenson.

Things turned sour for the Ocelots in the next two games as Cuyahoga Metro and Macomb defeated them in close games.

In the Cuyahoga game, Schoolcraft scored two goals but fell, 4-2. Pickard and Paul collected the goals for the Ocelots. Macomb, which was ranked 17th in the nation, just edged Schoolcraft in the next game, 1-0.

"They dominated the first half of the game, we totally dominated the second, but we just couldn't score," Christoff said.

Some of the outstanding players on the Schoolcraft team, according to Christoff are Frank Guerin, Rick Laurie, Chuck Scoggins, and Dale Lipa. Those four players had the defense together for the Ocelots.

Guerin, Laurie and Scoggins graduated from Stevenson, while Lipa graduated from Livonia Churchill.

Other outstanding players are Pat Palloni, Steve Stravos, Paul, Dan Scoggins, Ted Parasimos, Rene Bihari, Jim Clift, Tom Parent, Brad Biggers and Pickard.

Palloni, Clift, Parent, and Biggers are graduated from Stevenson.

Paul led the offensive attack for the Ocelots during the regular season with 11 goals to his credit. Manchi added six.

"This isn't a team that has one outstanding individual player. It's also a very unselfish team with a lot of guts," Christoff concluded.
