

'Spiritual' air noted in capital

Wesley Pippert, one of three United Press International (UPI) White House correspondents, says President Jimmy Carter has brought forth a "new spiritual atmosphere" to the Washington political scene.

"People in Washington are now aware of the forgotten truth of being 'born again,'" Pippert told a layman breakfast recently in Covenant Baptist Church, West Bloomfield.

"The President has given us a new awareness of spirituality."

A UPI reporter since 1966, Pippert said the Watergate scandal, "reminded us that the heart of people are evil and God reminded the nation of its sinfulness."

"Carter's administration thus far will be most remembered for his interest in human rights," he added. "This is the centerpiece of his administration."

"We don't have to agree with Carter politically, but we do have to admire his stand on moral issues."

THE PRESS is uncomfortable in dealing with Carter's views on religious issues, Pippert told the gathering.

"We as the press have neglected to deal with the moral dimensions of Washington," he said. "We did a great job of covering the 'tapes' and 'break-in' during Watergate but failed to explain what makes people in government thirst for power."

Pippert said he thinks newsmen don't really understand Carter's claim of Christian faith.

"He (Carter) teaches Sunday School once a month and has some newsworthy and interesting things to say," Pippert said. "The press, however, has been either timid or don't really care about his religious views."

The speaker expressed surprise that Carter doesn't receive more respect from some of his White House aides and associates. He cited the resignations of drug agency head Peter Bourne and Bert Lance, and said press secretary Jody Powell "has shown

irreverence at times," especially in handling the fellowship around Carter, his faith is not diluted," said Pippert.

ALSO A METHODIST minister and the author of five books, Pippert was the principal UPI reporter on the Watergate affair. In addition, he was a press aide for Illinois Senator Charles Percy in 1967 and 1968.

Pippert contributed chapters in the "Jaws of Victory," a book which was given lead reviews in both the New York Times and Washington Post and authored the book, "Memo for 1976: Some Political Options," based mainly on the Carter campaign.

A graduate of the University of Iowa, he has a congressional fellowship from the American Political Science Association. He also received a humanities fellowship from the University of Michigan.
