SINCE THAT TIME the district, which includes the western portion of West. Bloomfield Township and a northwest section of Farmington Hills, has learned that it will probably lose an additional \$257,000 in revenues, edding considerably to the severity of its financial situation.

The biggest loss of revenues comes in the form of state aid and is directly related to the declining enrollment in the Walled Lake District. Enrollment figures are a key element in the formala on which state aid revenues are based.
