

Metro tennis lead changes

The Troy Racquet Club assumed first place in the Metro Tennis League Adult A Division after defeating the Oak Park Racquet Club 214-114 in a match played at Oak Park.

With three matches played this season, Troy is in the number one position with a total score of 645 points, 22 points ahead of second-place Royal Oak Racquet Club.

The loss was Oak Park's second of the season. This is the first year that Troy has competed in the Metro Tennis League. They have been able to win all three matches thus far.

Royal Oak's 626 points trails Troy, while Oak Park follows in third place with 493 points. Royal Oak was leading the Metro Tennis League prior to Troy's victory over Oak Park. League standings are based on total number of games won in each match.

Fourth place in the Metro Tennis League is held by the Motor City Tennis Club, another new entry this season, with 331 games.

Troy had soundly defeated Oak Park, winning 17 of the 24 matches. Troy's next match will be against Royal Oak, Nov. 25 at the Royal Oak

Racquet Club. Starting time is 7 p.m.

THE SEASON'S first Metro Tennis League Adult B Division contest pitted the Birmingham Racquet Club against Royal Oak, Birmingham won a slim 194-129 victory. Birmingham players won 13 matches compared to 11 victories for Royal Oak players.

Oak Park will host Birmingham and Royal Oak will entertain Troy in the next two Adult B Division Metro Tennis League matches.
