

Emmett Kelly Jr. brings circus to Birmingham

The Emmett Kelly Jr. Star Spangled Circus comes to the Birmingham Theatre, Thursday-Saturday, Nov. 24-26, for seven performances.

The Emmett Kelly Circus has been conceived and produced in the style of one-ring circuses of Europe. Not the conventional touring circus, the Emmett Kelly Jr. production is tailored for the building into which it is booked.

The circus plays theatres, tents, college campuses, football fields, grandstand shows and stadiums. It was the first and only circus to perform at the White House.

The Emmett Kelly Jr. Circus line-up of acts includes Lilli Ana and her Leopards and Black Panther; Mario Manzini, who is known as the greatest escape artist since Houdini; the Berans, a hanging trapeze act; the Elkins Sisters, acrobatics with dogs and many more acts.

Mario Manzini will give Birmingham area residents a taste of his kind of excitement prior to the run of the circus, as well. He will perform one of his death-defying stunts Tuesday at noon in front of the Birmingham Theatre.

and best air travel film.

Haberdashery goes back to Gay '90s

Workers and visitors in downtown Detroit are finding food and drink menus at the Haberdashery in the Radisson Cadillac.

In contrast to the contemporary restoration of the hotel, the former site of the Motor Bar has been transformed into a turn-of-the-century restaurant. It serves as a fitting complement to the Gay '90s-clad policemen and restored trolleys passing by its Washington Boulevard windows.

In operation since the hotel's formal reopening in June, the Haberdashery has now moved into full service with its own kitchen.

Its new menu is being used as a model for 10 other Haberdasheries in Radisson's national collection of hotels. Offerings extend from soup, sandwiches and salads to steak dinners, with plenty of stops along the way. Among the unusual are the "pocket corner" sandwiches in which whole wheat pita bread is stuffed with a variety of fillings. Depending on the choice, ingredients might include combinations of alfalfa sprouts, chili, cheese, guacamole, lettuce, spicy garbanzo beans, falafel balls, crab and shrimp croquettes.

GARDEN DELIGHTS can include ground nuts and sunflower seeds, steamed, sautéed or fresh vegetables, sprouts, and cheeses served on a variety of breads. Other popular items include Tabouli salads of cold bulgur wheat, lemon, mint and tomato seasonings, chopped scallions, cucumber, celery and cherry tomatoes. French fries are served with skins on and patrons are invited to pick their own ingredients for a "Name Your Own" burger or omelet.

Under the banner, "Renew the Spirit, Refresh the Palate, Reorganize the Mind," the drink menu adds a humorous twist to a listing of ingredients. Those ordering a Pina Colada are cautioned to cancel rumba lessons and relax, and the Chee Chee is translated as "suntan for the soul."

In addition to full bar service including beer on draft, the Haberdashery provides a twist for aperitifs and dessert drinks with ice cream and fresh fruits including blue raspberries.

Aiming for the "young-at-heart," the Haberdashery decor is a complete turnabout from the sadness of the Motor Bar, according to Norton Locke, Radisson Cadillac general manager.

"We retained much of the magnificent wood paneling and the 45-foot bar," he said, "and then turned our designers loose to convert the space into a relaxed fun place that would have wide appeal to local patrons as well as hotel guest."

ADDING TO the old-fashioned motif are colorful, leaded-glass ceiling panels and chandeliers, wood carvings, framed pages of early catalogs and a popcorn pushcart. Bowls of popcorn are on every table.

The Haberdashery, including the screened-off bar, seats 165 persons with operating hours 11:30 a.m.-10 p.m. Monday-Friday. Food service stops at 9:30 p.m.

Entertainment will vary, said Haberdashery manager Marie Sherman. Holding forth through November is Elaine Terry Philpoe who offers a variety of song stylings while accompanying herself on guitar 8 p.m. daily.

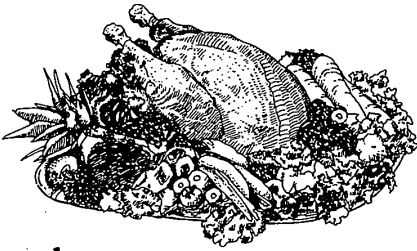
Concert time is 8 p.m. Court Basie, originally from Kansas City, was discovered by John Hammond and catapulted to fame in 1935. Basie's big band sound is
