Pewabic Pottery—The Christmas show will run through Jan. 6. Included are 30 invited professionals and 20 advanced students. Gallery hours are noon-4:30 p.m. Monday-Saturdays. This Michigan State University facility is at 10125 E. Jefferson, Detroit. Admission and parking are free.

Odyssey Gallery—Gibachrome prints by Monte Nagler of West Bloomfield will be on display at this Twelve-Oaks Mall gallery in Novi through December. 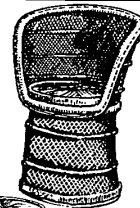
