Financial woes close Ted's restaurant

Little, major stockholder and manager. Little said the restaurant's financial difficulties began several years ago. "We undertook a major expansion program to double the size of the building and it was probably underfinanced," said Little.

TED'S FIRST OPENED in 1894 as a drive-in which served foot-long hot-dogs. Years later, the drive-in became an attraction to young people who engaged in the ritual of "Woodward. The so-called strip ran from below Fourteen Mile in Royal Oak north to Ted's at Square Lake Road. The dregarding problem attracted national media attention in the late '80s. In 1899. Ted's eliminated its drive-in service.

Following conversion of Ted's from a drive-in to a conventional restaurant, things began looking up. Longrange plans called for construction of a 180-room motel, a banquet room and another 200-seat restaurant.
