## John Cross joining law school faculty

John E. Cross of Farmington Hills has been appointed to a fulltime faculty position of associate professor at Thomas Cooley Law School, Lansing. He presently is supervising assistant corporation counsel for the City of Detroit.

He joins the faculty after 18 years with the law department of Detroit where he had litigation experience in all facets of municipal law.

He will teach municipal corporations and professional responsibility beginning in January.
