## Soroptimists announce citizenship award

The Farmington-Novi International Soroptimist Club is again sponsoring the "Youth Citizenship Awards" program for local high school students.

Deadline for student application is Dec. 15. Seniors graduating no later than June, 1979, are eligible if they attend the following schools: Farmington and North Farmington Senior High schools, Harrison High School, Our Lady of Mercy and Novi High schools.

Applicants will be judged on student activities, community activities, awards and recognition, aims and purposes. Each individual also is asked to describe in his own words his family citizenship, his community citizenship responsibilities, and his concept of his role as a citizen of the world.

Three local awards of \$150, \$100 and \$50 are given. Winners of these will be feted at a special program after the holidays.

In 1977, local winners were Christine Fritz of Novi High School, first award; Elizabeth Gable of Farmington High School, second award, and Susan Riley of North Farmington High School, third award.

In addition, the top local winner is eligible for the district award of \$100; the top district winner for the regional award of \$1,200; and the regional winner for the national award of \$1,500. In 1972, the local winner also became the district winner and in 1972, a local winner received the national award.

Soroptimist International is a classified service organization for professional and executive business women comprised of over 1,000 clubs and a membership of over 30,000. The Youth Citizen Award program affirms its belief in the integrity, worth and ability of youth.
