Police seek pair's extradition

Brothers are linked to slaying

West Bloomfield Police will conlinue to press for the extradition of two Pontiac men, convicted in Texas this week of armed robbery, to stand trial in Michigan for the brutal slaving of a township woman last June.

"The paper work is in progress. Well be bringing them back," says West Bloomfield Det. Sgt. Wayne Allen.

The Meyers brothers, Daniel and Charles, are charged in Michigan with first degree murder in the beating death of Mrs. Cladys Smith, a 72-year-old West Bloomfield widow hol lived in a modest home on Pontiac Trail near Haggerty, 21, was found guilty of armed robbery last summer before a jury in Bosque Courty, Texas. He was sentenced to 99 years in jail. His brother, Charles, 22, was sen-

tenced to 25 years in jail.
"They don't fool around in those
Texas courts," commented another
West Bloomfield officer involved in the
investigation.
The brutality of the Smith murder
shocked police and kept neighbors terrified until the suspects were located.

IT TOOK MORE than two months of investigations and the questioning of more than 200 persons before police compiled auditient evidence linking the brothers to the Smith murder.

West Bloomfield police eventually tracked down the brothers after the day's arrest in Texas on the armed robbery charge.

Allen then made two trips to Texas on the case. He expects to be one of the officers sent to Texas to bring the suspects back to Michigan for trial early next year.

Apparently, the Meyers left Mich-

igan for Texas in July. His brother Charles was on parole to Michigan from Alabama on an armed robberty conviction.

Mrs. Smith's body was found June 28 by West Bloomfield Ptl. Patrick Monte, called to the home when neigh-bors alerted the police department of unusual conditions at her home.

ONE NEIGHBOR noticed Mrs. Smith's dog tied outside the back door after dark. The medical examiner reported she had been bludgeoned to death during the day and died of a compound skull fracture.

The Meyers parents' home, 37 Edwards in Pontiac, was searched and several of the stolen items were recovered.

Three two-man West Bloomfield teams, Michigan State Police, state crime laboratory personnel and polyg-raph operators worked on the case, which led to warrants being issued for the brothers in August.


