Boys back work for wives

Today's high school seniors feel it is acceptable, and often desirable, for both a husband and wife to be employed, a new nationwide survey indicates.

They also endorse a quite equal divison of child care, according to the

Social Research (ISR).

But the young teople oppose a complete reversal of see roles, the study stores. Elight-free per cent rejected the idea of a wife working full-time while her husband was not working, and 64 per cent would not accept a situation in which the husband worked only half-time, even if the couple had no children.

A. Regula Herzog, Jerold G. Bachman and Lloyd D. Johnston evanined the personal preferences of a 1977

nationwide sample of about 3,000 seniors. Five questions were asked about hasband/wife division of employment, child care and housework.

'Our inferest was prompted by the ecormous influx of married women into the labor market during the last decades,' he researchers said. 'In the control of the child care and housework.' The data show that among the seniors the most widely preferred arrangement for a couple with no children is full-time work for the husband, and full- or half-time work for the husband and full- or half-time work for the wife. The more traditional arrangement in which the husband has a full-time job and the wife is not employed

outside the home was rated less pref-erable by the seniors surveyed.

The preferences shift dramatically when a preschool child enters the picture. Then, 47 per cent of the males and 35 per cent of the females desire full-time work for the husband and no outside employment for the wife.
