Drummer Buddy Rich brings his Buddy Rich band featuring Steve Marcus on tenor sax to Detroit's historic Music Hall Center at 6:30 p.m. Sunday, Jan. 21.

Rich's career started at the age of three when he joined his parents on the vaudeville stage, playing the drums to "Stars and Stripes Forever." During his long and successful career, he has played with Bunny Berigan, Artie Shaw and the Tommy Dorsey Band, to name a few.

After a stint with the Harry James Band in the early '60s, Rich formed his own group and has developed a sound

and a following that keeps him booked throughout the year in every corner of the nation.

His appearances on network television and his inimitable personality have made him one of the best known drummers of all time. His recent album with jazz great Mel Torme has won acclaims from critics as the long-overdue teaming of two musical giants.
