Dressed in colorful costumes, the ensemble provides two hours of representative folk dances from Slavic countries, including Macedonia, Bulgaria, Russia, Croatia, Serbia, Slovakia, Ukraine and the Eastern European countries of Moldavia and Romania.

The group has traveled to Poland and Yugosla-

via, performing and gathering new dances for their program.

Under the direction of Dr. Helen Kovach-Tarakanov, a Russian professor at Oakland University in Rochester, the 30-member group is comprised of Oakland University students and provide their own orchestration.
